All accepted full conference papers will be published in Springer series CCIS (Communications in Computer and Information Science). Best papers as further developed versions are published also in a special Issue of International Journal of Networking and Virtual Organisations. Papers are presented in two tracks: scientific research and practice-oriented reports, and in two forms: full papers and short papers. The word count of submitted short papers should not exceed 2500 words. The full papers are expected to be 4000 - 5000 words long.
